Important Safety Information

- Please note that the cutting blade continues to run for a short period after you let go of the throttle trigger – This is called the flywheel effect.
- · Be sure that you understand the information contained in the manual.
- Persons with pacemakers only: The ignition system of the power tool produces an electromagnetic field of a very low intensity. This field may interfere with some pacemakers. Consult your doctor if you have concerns.
- · Work calmly and carefully in daylight conditions and only when visibility is good. Stay alert so as not to endanger others.
- This power tool produces toxic exhaust fumes as soon as the engine is running. These fumes may be colourless and odourless and contain unburned hydrocarbons and benzoyl. Never run the engine indoors or in poorly ventilated locations.
- Wear appropriate safety equipment, strong footwear and face protection.
- · If the power tool is subjected to unusually high loads for which it was not designed (e.g. heavy impact or a fall), always check that it is in good condition before continuing work.
